



by Melanie Dickerson



Except Sarah's martyrdom is important to a lot of people, people who don't take kindly to what I'm trying to do. And the more I learn, the less certain I am about what's right. I don't know what will be worse: the guilt of staying silent or the consequences of speaking up . . . Coming in August 2018.

So things are already pretty strange. But they're about to get much stranger.




Keeper of the Bees


